CLUB VOLUNTEER POLICY - ORANGEFIELD OLD BOYS FC

All volunteers are encouraged to demonstrate exemplary behaviour and use their position to set a positive example for the young players at our club.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this Volunteering Policy is to:

- Encourage participation from our local community in club activities.
- Define clear roles and expectations for volunteers.
- Provide support, training, and recognition to ensure a positive experience.
- Promote a safe and inclusive environment for all involved.

VOLUNTEER RECRUITMENT

Open Invitation: Volunteering at Orangefield OBFC is open to all individuals aged 16+ who share our passion for football and community spirit, regardless of background, experience, or ability.

How to Get Involved: We advertise opportunities through:

- Club noticeboard at the pitch.
- Orangefield OBFC Facebook/Instagram/X pages and WhatsApp groups.
- Word of mouth at matches and training sessions.
- Annual open day (e.g., planned for June 2025).

Process: Interested individuals should contact our Volunteer Coordinator (details above). A short informal chat will assess interests and match them to a role.

For roles involving minors, an AccessNI check is required (arranged by the club).



VOLUNTEER ROLES

We offer a variety of roles to suit different skills and availability:

- Coaches: Assist with training sessions or match days (qualifications supported-see Section 4).
- Groundskeepers: Help maintain our pitch and facilities (e.g., line marking, tidying).
- Match Day Support: Manage kit, refreshments, or gate entry during games.
- Committee Members: Contribute to club planning and decisions.
- Event Helpers: Support fundraising or community events (e.g., summer BBQ).
- A full list of roles and descriptions is available from the Volunteer Coordinator or on our club website.

SUPPORT AND TRAINING

Induction: All new volunteers receive a welcome pack (including this policy, club code of conduct, and safeguarding info) and a 15-minute induction with the Volunteer Coordinator.

Training Opportunities: We encourage skill development:

- Access to Irish FA e-learning modules (e.g., "Introduction to Coaching") via the Club Portal.
- Support to pursue formal qualifications (e.g., Coaching badges) where funding allows.
- On-the-job guidance from experienced club members.
- **Equipment:** Volunteers are provided with necessary gear (e.g., hi-vis vests, whistles) as needed.
- **Check-Ins:** The Volunteer Coordinator meets with volunteers quarterly to discuss their experience and any needs.



EXPECTATIONS

- Commitment: Volunteers are asked to commit to a minimum of 2 hours per month, though flexibility is key—we understand busy schedules!
- Conduct: All volunteers must follow the Orangefield OBFC Code of Conduct, promoting respect, teamwork, and safety.
- Safeguarding: Volunteers working with youth must complete safeguarding training and adhere to our Safeguarding Policy.
